## FROM OUR INTERIM PASTOR

Have you ever tried to imagine what life might be like if God took a vacation from us? Suppose God went away to a nice sunny place in an alternate universe and left us unattended for a month or two.



Many of you know that I am a fan of 'disaster movies'. I know it is silly and completely unfeasible. That's probably what I like about them, they are a momentary diversion from the real problems that we can and must tackle.

Like the movie "10.4." "10.4" is the story of a series of mega earthquakes on the west coast that threaten all of life there. The quakes are caused by a previously undetected deep fault line. Scientists estimate that millions of people will die if the quakes go unchecked and so they work frantically to set nuclear charges in particular places to try and neutralize the quakes. At first it looks as if the charges are working and have thwarted the worst of the quake but then suddenly the quake continues with all of its force and essentially makes California an island. At the end of the movie the narrator reminds us that we cannot control the forces of nature.

Some people think that something like that would happen, the whole natural order would go haywire, if God went away for a time. I don't. I believe God created the universe with a beautiful natural precision and intricate interrelatedness. There might be times that humanity interferes with that, such as the way that fish die in polluted waters. But I don't think that nature would cease to operate if God were gone for a while.

Instead, I think we can look at human history and see the types of things that would go splat if God were on vacation. We can see it in human history because while God never leaves us, we often leave God. Stalin's death prisons would be a good example. The killing of whole tribes of people in Africa would be another. Hatred. Fear. Malice. A decade ago one of my best friends from Chicago, an African American woman who raised three decent, beautiful sons, called to tell me that her grandson was standing on the street corner with some of his

school chums; they weren't doing anything, just talking and listening to music, when they heard gunfire. Before the firing stopped her grandson was dead.

And then there is the more subtle evidence of our leaving God. It happens bit by bit, small effect by small effect. We let our prayer life lapse and we begin to sense a deepening emptiness in our lives. We choose sleeping in over worship and find that the more we do it the easier it is to do even as we don't quite put together the fact that we feel more restless and less settled than we used to. We start choosing making money over loving God, getting ahead over doing the right thing, hoarding over sharing, even as we sense that something is missing in our lives. We settle for less of God because we want more of what we want. And one day we wake up and think that we have been gone too long to come back to God or maybe God doesn't want us anymore or maybe it doesn't really matter anyway and how did our life get into such a state as this.

Every encounter with God, wherever it occurs, in prayer, in worship, in service; every single one is a small little foretaste of heaven. And fortunately, no matter how far we go God always wants us back. So if God never takes a vacation from us, why do we choose to take one from God? Why do we choose to skip those moments of heavenly peace and joy? Are the other things really all that great? If you have been away from God in any way, come back. It'll be the best decision you ever make.

July is nearly upon us. The year 2018 is already half over. And two of my four years of seminary schooling are already completed! Many of you beautiful people at Hope said to me as I began to leave for Columbus in 2016 that it would be over before I knew it; I didn't believe you, but I do now! These two years have not been easy for Chris and me, but they have been so worth it, and I cannot believe all of this is half over! ## 2018 SOUTHERN OHIO SYNOD ASSEMBLY

The theme for assembly was "Being Church Together: What does the Lord require of us?" The focus scripture was Micah 6:8. The highlight for us was the inspiring Synod-wide worship service lead by **Bishop Suzanne Darcy Dillahunt** preaching on Micah 6:8 "Do justice, love mercy, and walk humbly."



As your sent voting members, we voted on Synod Council recommendations for the 2018 assembly.

1. To approve the agenda for the 2018 Southern Ohio Assembly
2. To adopt the rules of procedure for the Assembly
3. To approve the Mission and Ministry Plan for the Southern Ohio Synod for fiscal year 2019
4. To approve the required updates to the Synod Constitution
5. To approve the 2019 Compensation Guidelines for rostered ministers in the Southern Ohio Synod.

In addition, we voted on 2018 Synod Council members and on 2019 Churchwide Assembly members both lay and clergy.

And we voted on a Resolution that resolved the Assembly urge the congregations of the Southern Ohio Synod to appeal to their congressional representatives expressing their concern regarding the injustice of the separating of children from their families seeking refugee status in the United States of America.

"Stronger and Better Together....Joining Jesus in the Restoration of the World" is Southern Ohio Mission Territory's Vision as we live out the Mission to share the Good News of God's love in Jesus Christ. Various reports were given and/or submitted to the Assembly by the Bishop, Synod Council, Conferences, Task Forces, Affiliates and Partners as together we live out that vision and mission.

Various workshops & service projects were conducted concurrently at three different scheduled times. Bonnie and I were able to cover five different events. We thank you for sending us to the Southern Ohio Synod Assembly as your representatives. - **Ron and Bonnie Long**

## CONGREGATION HIGHLIGHTS

June 14, 2018

- **Val Schneider, Treasurer:** The council voted to purchase a 12 month CD from Capital One for \$50,000 to help insure there is money for the salary of our future minister.
- **Karen Schneider, Stewardship:** The committee will be collecting items for a raffle basket for the Northwest Hands Fair on August 8th.
- **Mary Beth Taylor, Property/Maintenance:** The council voted to pay Scherzinger Pest Control to treat termites with Centricon for \$1412.
- The septic tank socks had to be cleaned again. The weekly applications of sugar and cornmeal helped, but not sufficiently. The cleaning may become an annual requirement.
- The lease agreement for YBRCC and the church insurance building are being reviewed.
- **Judy Royse, Fellowship:** On August 10 at 7 pm there will be a Flag Retirement Ceremony for all.



Worn flags may be donated for this event.

- **Pr. Vicki** will be on vacation after the service July 1 and back at Hope on August 5.
- Council voted to cancel their July meeting since there are no pressing issues to consider at this time.
- The Call Committee was given the name of a candidate, but the person declined to be interviewed.
- The Computer Task Force recommended that we try **Church Track** for a 3 month trial period @ \$10 per month to see if it will work for us.
- **Thank you to Ron and Bonnie Long who attended the Southern Ohio Synod Assembly on Jun1-2.**
- The council voted to have **Lucinda Hardin** cover the Fellowship Hall rental duties for a six month period for \$25 per event.
- During Pr. Vicki's vacation, the services will be covered by retired pastors.
- Family Fun Night will be at 6-8:30 pm on June 15.
- **The next council meeting is now August 9, 2018.**
