

PR. CHRISTIE'S CORNER

Give Thanks with a Grateful Heart

The Lord has done great things for us, and we are filled with joy. - Psalm 126:3 (NIV)

Many of us love singing "Give Thanks" during our offering time on Sunday



Gratitude Journal – Keep a journal of things for which you are grateful. You can carry the journal with you and write everything down throughout the day. Or - pick a time of day and write 3 things for which you are thankful that day. You can even do this on your phone, using a gratitude journal app or a list-making app.

Gratitude Game (Pickup Sticks)— - Using the game "Pick Up Sticks," assign a category of gratitude to each color. For example: Brown - person; Yellow - place; Green - food; Blue - thing; Purple - anything Follow the usual rules of the game, but each time someone picks up a stick, they share something in the category of that color for which they are thankful.

Colorful Candies - Similar to the game above, you can do this activity on your own or with a group. Using some M&M's, Skittles, or any type of candy that has different colors, again assign a category to each color. Each time you pick up a candy of that color, express your gratitude for something in that category, either aloud to the group or in prayer to God.


Gratitude Prompts - Using small pieces of paper, write a "gratitude prompt" on each paper. Fold the papers, and place them in a jar, basket, etc. Examples of "gratitude"



prompts" are: Something you enjoy doing; Someone who loves you; Your favorite animal; Where you've seen God in your life, etc. You can

find many examples if you search "gratitude prompts" online. You can use these on your own – draw one out each morning and have that guide your gratitude prayer for the day. Or, do this in a group, and have each person share aloud about the prompt they drew.

Gratitude Prayer - At the end of each day, enter into prayer following these steps: 1. Place yourself in God's presence. 2. Review the day with gratitude - thank God for ALL of it. 3. Pay attention to your emotions and reflect on what you did, said or thought in those instances. 4.



Whether you choose these activities or something else, I invite you to be intentional about expressing your gratitude throughout the month of November. Expressing our gratitude regularly gives us the opportunity to connect more deeply with God, and increases our overall thankfulness and joy throughout our lives. Each, day let us always remember to give thanks with a grateful heart!

attention, slow down, and revere the world we live in. Bible study meets Thursdays at 1p.m., and is available on zoom as well as in-person.



COUNCIL HIGHLIGHTS

October 10,, 2024

♦Ron Long, Financial Secretary: There has been a 2% increase in

our budget over the past years showing that we do not have a spending problem.

- **♦Chris Arany, Treasurer:** Total income for September was \$53,295.53 including the \$30,000 donation for updating the Fellowship Hall and supporting activities in it. Our budget deficit is \$22,150 for the year.
- **♦Lana Albright, Spiritual Life:** The committee sends cards and notes to sit-ins and those with medical issues. **Karen Schneider** is working on the WHOO Thankoffering Service on November 10.
- **♦Joy Ivins, Worship/Music:** On October 13 Hope will receive 9 new members including a baptism. **Karen Schweinfest** is recruiting singers for St. Paul's Church's anniversary in December.
- **◆Erica Leppert, Christian Education:** The youth are preparing a special box for receiving the commitment cards.

- **+Karen Schweinfest, Fellowship:** There will be a reception for McKenna Freland's Baptism on October 13, and a special service for the first Sunday in Advent.
- ◆Ron Long for Generosity: He asked all council and Generosity members to complete their commitment cards early to share the increased amount with the congregation. The Time and Talent forms will be distributed at the beginning of the year.
- ◆Council passed the motion of increasing pledges from this year forward.
- **◆Carmen Hasdorff, Property:** There was damage to our roof and septic system.
- **♦Karen Schweinfest, Fellowship:** The committee organized receptions for the baptism and new members on October 13.
- **♦Pastor Christie**: The council passed the motion to accept the proposed individuals into membership.
- ◆The council also passed the motion of restructuring Council which reduces the number serving.
- ♦ Mike Schweinfest, Interim President: A Congregational Meeting will be scheduled about restructuring the council.
- ◆The meeting was adjourned with the Lord's prayer.


