

### PR. CHRISTIE'S CORNER

## Come to the Manger Advent Worship

"This will be a sign for you: you will find a child wrapped in bands of cloth and lying in a manger." – Luke 2:12 (NRSVUE)

In the church, the four Sundays prior to Christmas are called "Advent." This



I don't know about you, but waiting with celebratory anticipation can be challenging at this time of year. Some people in our community look so forward to Christmas that they've had their Christmas trees up since the day after Halloween and are playing nonstop



Christmas music already. Children, of course, are writing their letters to Santa and dreaming of all the wonderful things to come. In contrast, some of us might be feeling busy and stressed. And others might be feeling lonely or depressed.

This time of waiting can be difficult for many reasons. So, how do we celebrate Advent when so many other things are going on in our lives?

This year for Advent worship, our theme is "Come to the Manger." For me, when I think of the manger on that first Christmas morning, I think of peacefulness and stillness. I picture the simplicity of new parents, baby Jesus, and all those visitors, huddled in a small cave, all smushed in with the animals. I feel the chill of that cool air, as Mary wraps the child tenderly in soft cloth.

The night of Jesus's birth was a miracle beyond our comprehension, a truly holy night.

But, Mary and Joseph didn't suddenly end up there, where all was calm and all was bright. No, they had an intense

journey to that beautiful manger scene. Mary's journey began when she took a huge leap of faith and agreed to carry the Christ Child, after a frightening visit from an angel. Joseph soon joined in the journey with her, but not before another terrifying visit from an angel convinced him that Mary's



child was indeed God's child. Can you imagine how stressful things were in the meantime? They later found out that they would have to travel to Bethlehem to have the baby. (Pregnant Mary maybe rode on a donkey...if she

was lucky.) Then, they arrived in Bethlehem only to be turned away by family members and strangers alike, to be told there was no room.

Whatever we are feeling this Advent season, I am confident that Mary and Joseph had similar emotions. They were probably excited, yes, but also afraid, anxious, uncertain, overwhelmed, and stressed. They shared the exhaustion and the loneliness that we sometimes feel at the holidays.

And so, this Advent, let's journey with the holy couple. As we come together to worship at Hope these next four Sundays, let's bring our joys, our sorrows, and our fears. Let's feel the peace of that holy night together each week, peace in the midst of our stress. We can trust all of our worries to God, knowing that Mary and Joseph did the same on their difficult journey.

This Advent, I invite you all, to come to the manger.



Here is a description of the book: "To prepare for Christmas in our society is to be sucked into a vortex of indulgence, from decor to gifts to calorie-rich foods. Layer upon layer of tinsel, lights, and wrapping paper create the illusion of abundance, disguising the feeling of emptiness in our souls. The arrival of the Messiah, by



contrast, is true abundance disguised by the impression of scarcity. Training our eyes to see through the rough stable, the adolescent mother, and the anxious escape to Egypt, we can see in that poverty and powerlessness the wonder of God's abundant life and grace coming down to dwell among us. Bible study meets Thursdays at 1p.m., and is available on zoom as well as in-person. Contact Pastor Christie if you have any questions, are interested in joining via zoom, or would be interested in a study series that meets at a different time. Join us for fun, fellowship, and sharing God's word together!


- Small green wooden craft sticks
