# PR. CHRISTIE'S CORNER

#### .Holy Week Lectio Divina

"Holy Week" is what we in the church call the week that begins with Palm Sunday and ends in Easter Sunday. The week can feel like a whirlwind, as we follow Jesus's journey from the celebration of Palm



Sunday, through the evening of the last supper, through his arrest and crucifixion. The week culminates of course in the ultimate celebration of the empty tomb on Easter Sunday!

Because there are so many opportunities for worship and activities that week, and because so many topics are covered so quickly, the week can feel a bit overwhelming. On top of worship activities, we all are still living our regular lives. Maybe we're planning Easter celebrations with family and friends, or gearing up for other spring activities. And with all of this, perhaps we can feel a bit stressed out or lose focus in our prayer lives.



This year during Holy Week, I would like to challenge us all to do a daily prayer and meditation using the ancient and sacred practice of Lectio Divina, to help us focus ourselves on journeying with Jesus throughout this time.

# How to practice Lectio Divina:

1. **Prepare** - Get comfortable and prepare your heart and mind for prayer and meditation. You may find it helpful to light a candle, find another object to help you focus on your time with God, or play quiet music in the background.

- **Read** Read the scripture passage slowly 2. and carefully, possibly multiple times.
- 3. Meditate – Breathe deeply and think about the passage. You may want to think about placing yourself in the story, or focusing on a particular phrase that is feeling most meaningful for you today.
- **Pray** Bring your concerns to God, ask for 4. wisdom regarding the passage, and ask that God bring you the "peace that surpasses all understanding" in your life today.
- **Contemplate** Rest in God's presence. 5. Listen for God's voice, and allow God's word to fill your heart.





# EASTER INSIGHTS

Did you know the word Easter never appears in the Bible? It may be a variant of the name Eostre, a pagan fertility goddess who symbolized rebirth and spring. Eostre stems



from the Proto-Germanic word for dawn, which Christians connect to Jesus' victory over darkness.

The ancient tradition of Easter baskets also has ties to Eostre, whose symbol was a rabbit. Christians likely adapted the practice of bringing eggs and seeds as an offering to Eostre. Some Orthodox Christians continue a tradition of having a priest bless baskets of Easter food on Holy Saturday. Items usually hold special symbolism, such as Paska bread, cured meats, colored eggs, salt, horseradish and lamb-shaped butter.



#### March 13, 2025

◆Possible new guidelines for the rental of the Fellowship Hall were discussed.



- Jellybeans


#### What you do:

- 1. From the bag's bottom, cut two 2-inch circles. Set aside.
- 2. From the sides, cut two 10-inch circles.
- Draw a thin spiral on each large circle and cut along the lines. Crinkle spirals gently.
- Starting at the center, wrap one spiral into a nest. Glue every few inches to hold it.
- 5. Glue one small circle to the bottom of the nest.
- 6. Repeat with the other spiral. Fill nests with jellybeans and give to a friend!
